

These are p2p questions to discuss with new believers after reading a chapter from the Bible.

Luke 15 Bible Study Questions

11-13: What are some reasons that you want to escape responsibility? Why does anonymity free people to live reckless lives? Can we ever do things in secret or away from those we love?

17-19: Discuss the attitude of the son as he sets off to return home. What is he willing to admit to his father? Is it better to be a servant of God or a servant of the world? What state must we be in when we return to the Father?

20-24: How is Christ like the father in the story?

25-32: Why does the older son not rejoice at the return of his brother? What does this say about him? What does this teach us about God and how he responds to us? What are some ways that you are like the older son?

Luke 16 Bible Study Questions

steward - a person whose responsibility it is to take care of something.

1-7: In what ways was the manager not a good steward? What qualities are required to be a good steward? How does this affect "chores" or tasks that may be unappealing or boring?

shrewd - having or showing sharp powers of judgment; astute.

8: How are the "children of this world" more shrewd than believers? How should the behavior of believers differ from non-believers?

10-12: How does our faithfulness in small things affect our faithfulness in all things? What does it mean to be faithful with our money? How can we use our resources so that it will have eternal affects?

10-13: Who is really the owner of all we have? What is the difference between a steward and an owner? What happens when we forget who the owner is?

10:13: What does it mean to have an eternal perspective on our possessions? How does giving help us to keep an eternal perspective and to keep God first in our lives?
